than 1500 projects, including over 100 projects in Queensland since opening an office here in 2007.

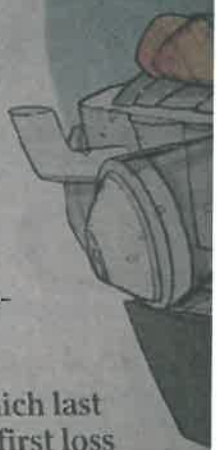
